## Alternative Certification (ACP) EPP Process

Students seeking Texas teacher certification must first be admitted to the HBU Educator Preparation Program (EPP).

BEFORE EPP ADMISSION
Earn a <b>Bachelor's degree</b> or higher
Submit a completed electronic Graduate admissions application
Upload all transcripts where courses were taken for college/university credit
Have a <b>minimum cumulative GPA or last 60 hours GPA of 2.75</b> or higher on all college/university course work attempted
Have a <b>Content coursework with a 2.5 GPA</b> (overall or last 60 hours) <sup>-</sup> EC-6 or EC-12 Special Ed candidates: 1 ELA, 1 Math, 1 Science, 1 Social Studies course <sup>-</sup> Math or Science candidates: 15 content hours <sup>-</sup> All other Content Areas: 12 content hours
Demonstrate English Oral Proficiency
Successfully pass the EPP Admission Interview
AFTER EPP ADMISSION
Observe all guidelines outlined in the EPP Handbook
Complete all certification plan coursework with a 3.0 GPA and "B" or better
Pass all <b>Content exams</b> and request a Letter of Employment Eligibility from the CPPE Director to allow for hire as a fulltime teacher-of-record
For Internship eligibility, must have completed nine (9) course hours in the certification program including EDUC 6302 or EDUC 6312
Secure a fulltime teaching position that aligns with the approved certification plan
Be able to pass a <b>national criminal history check</b> as required by the Texas Education Agency (TEA). A conviction or deferred adjudication may result in ineligibility for Texas issue of a educator certificate. The candidate may request a Preliminary Criminal History Evaluation from TEA if there is reason to believe ineligibility may occur due to a prior conviction
Complete CPPE and TEA processes to obtain an Intern certificate
Complete an ACP Internship (2 semesters; contract-paid teacher-of-record)
Pass the required the PPR exams
Apply and pay for a Standard certificate

ACP candidates have the option to transfer to the Masters (M.Ed.) in Curriculum and Instruction with Initial Certification program. Contact the ACP Director for more information.
